**Gospel Meditation:**

A stranger in a foreign land, I was exhausted and homesick as my summer Spanish immersion ended in Guatemala. The rusty minivan arriving outside my small residence filled me with joyful hope. I was flying home to the U.S. and would be, at long last, completely happy. Or so I thought. After about half an hour of being home, I thought to myself, "This place is boring. I want to go somewhere." So, I hopped in my car and left to see my friends. As I drove, I wistfully wondered, "Where am I truly at home?"

The feast of Epiphany has a lot to do with our notion of home. Where is our origin? Where are we going?

When is our wandering done? Saint Matthew tells us of the Magi, "They were overjoyed at seeing the star."

This star will bring them home, to a place where their questing will end, and they will be satisfied.

Their real home is neither in the East nor in the earthly Jerusalem. Somehow, their home is wherever this boy and his parents are.

If you're a teenager or older, you probably know by now that every physical home we have is temporary. So, we look up at the countless stars in our proverbial skies: things which bedazzle and beckon us to follow toward peace.

The Gospel invites us to behold that — at long last — God has sent us a star to follow home, one that whispers, "Follow me! I will take you home!" Perhaps that star is your spouse. A friend. An opportunity. A cause. An intuition about a new direction. A prayer group. What is it for you? How will you know? It will lead you to Mary and Joseph and their son, and you will be home.

**Meditación del Evangelio:**

Siendo un extraño en una tierra extranjera, estaba exhausto y nostálgico cuando mi inmersión de verano en español terminó en Guatemala. La minivan oxidada que llegaba a las afueras de mi pequeña residencia me llenó de alegre esperanza. Estaba volando a casa en los Estados Unidos y sería, por fin, completamente feliz. O eso pensaba.

Después de aproximadamente media hora de estar en casa, pensé: "Este lugar es aburrido. Quiero ir a alguna parte".

Así que me subí a mi coche y me fui a ver a mis amigos. Mientras conducía, me preguntaba melancólicamente: "¿Dónde estoy realmente en casa?"

La fiesta de la Epifanía tiene mucho que ver con nuestra noción de hogar. ¿Dónde está nuestro origen?

¿Adónde vamos? ¿Cuándo termina nuestro deambular? San Mateo nos dice de los Reyes Magos: "Se llenaron de alegría al ver la estrella". Esta estrella los llevará a casa, a un lugar donde su búsqueda terminará y estarán satisfechos.

Su verdadero hogar no está ni en el Oriente ni en la Jerusalén terrenal. De alguna manera, su hogar está donde sea que estén este niño y sus padres.

Si eres un adolescente o mayor, probablemente ya sepas que cada hogar físico que tenemos es temporal. Por lo tanto, miramos hacia las innumerables estrellas en nuestros cielos proverbiales: cosas que nos deslumbran y nos invitan a seguir hacia la paz.

El Evangelio nos invita a contemplar que, por fin, Dios nos ha enviado una estrella para seguir a casa, una estrella que susurra: "¡Sígueme! ¡Te llevaré a casa!" Tal vez esa estrella sea tu cónyuge. Un amigo.

Una oportunidad. Una causa. Una intuición sobre una nueva dirección. Un grupo de oración. ¿Qué es para ti?

¿Cómo lo sabrás? Te llevará a María, a José y a su hijo, y estarás en casa.

This weekend we celebrate the **Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord**. The term *Epiphany* comes from Greek *epiphaneia*, and means “manifestation.” In the early days of the Church it referred to the *manifestation* of God to the world through the Baptism of Christ... but in the 4<sup>th</sup> century the focus shifted to His birth and the *manifestation* of God through Christ to the world symbolized by the Magi from the East.

There is a special blessing associated with the Feast of the Epiphany. Traditionally, a home is blessed by the Head of the Household on the feast day (*Jan 6<sup>th</sup>*) or on the closest Sunday (*this year Jan 7<sup>th</sup>*), but the blessing may be performed at any time.

**A House Blessing on the Feast of the Epiphany:**

Using chalk (*preferably blessed... but any chalk will suffice*), write the following inscription over the doorway of the home:  
**20 + C + M + B + 24**

The numbers on either side reflect the year of the blessing (20-24). The letters have a dual meaning. They are the initials of the traditional names of the 3 Magi: **C**aspar, **M**elchior, and **B**althasar. They also abbreviate the Latin words **C**hristus **M**ansionem **B**enedicat... translated: May Christ Bless the House. The crosses represent the protection of the Precious Blood of Christ, whose Sacred Name we invoke and the holiness of the 3 Magi sanctified by their adoration of the Infant Jesus. The inscription is made at or above the front door so that all who enter and depart may enjoy God’s blessing.

**The Blessing:** Lord God almighty, Bless + this home, and under its shelter let there be health, chastity, self-conquest, humility, goodness, mildness, obedience to your commandments, and thanksgiving to God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. May Your blessing remain always in this home and on those who live here; through Christ, our Lord. Amen,.

*Each room of the house may then be sprinkled with Holy Water – (this is not necessary for the blessing but should be done if Holy Water is available.)*

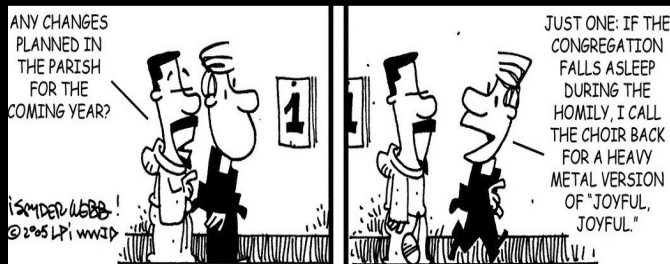

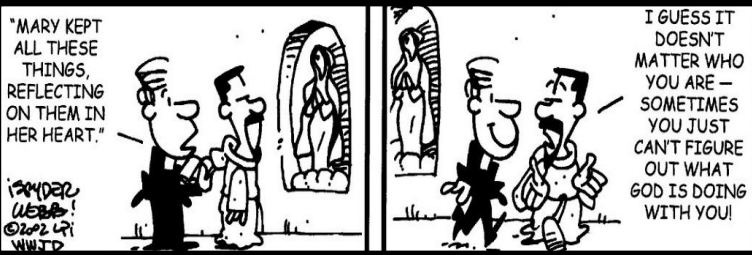
