Gospel Meditation:

What is the secret to sharing in God's power to overcome our difficulties?

Mary teaches us this in the prophecy of her pierced heart. This Sunday, the old man Simeon prophecies that when her son faces opposition, Mary's soul will be pierced by a sword. The seemingly pointless agony of a mother helplessly watching her son be mocked, tortured, killed and then cruelly descrated in death by a spear — somehow this piercing of her heart releases a power by which "the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." *(Luke 2:35).* What to make of this?

Whatever problems we currently face, the deepest threat is finally that evil thoughts are hidden in the human heart: hatred, envy, pride, lust, greed and so on. Behind every tyrant's injustice, for example, is a heart unpierced by love. Evil hides in our hearts. Mary's pierced heart, and its suffering love for her son, reveals and scatters these evil thoughts, and replaces them with love, forgiveness, generosity and peace.

This week, I invite us to ponder Mary's pierced heart. Her heart is quietly at work for us in the Church and world, exposing our evil thoughts and making a path for her son's divine love. This is how she gently cooperates in our salvation. Closed hearts are our biggest problem; love-pierced hearts are the ultimate power to overcome every difficulty.

Meditación del Evangelio:

¿Cuál es el secreto para compartir el poder de Dios para vencer nuestras dificultades? María nos enseña esto en la profecía de su corazón traspasado. Este domingo, el anciano Simeón profetiza que cuando su hijo se enfrente a la oposición, el alma de María será atravesada por una espada. La agonía aparentemente sin sentido de una madre que ve impotente cómo su hijo es burlado, torturado, asesinado y luego cruelmente profanado en la muerte por una lanza, de alguna manera esta perforación de su corazón libera un poder por el cual "los pensamientos de muchos corazones pueden ser revelados" (*Lucas 2:35*). ¿Qué hacer con esto?

Cualesquiera que sean los problemas a los que nos enfrentamos actualmente, la amenaza más profunda es finalmente que los malos pensamientos se oculten en el corazón humano: el odio, la envidia, el orgullo, la lujuria, la codicia, etc. Detrás de la injusticia de cada tirano, por ejemplo, hay un corazón no traspasado por el amor. El mal se esconde en nuestros corazones. El corazón traspasado de María, y su amor sufriente por su hijo, revela y dispersa estos malos pensamientos, y los sustituye por el amor, el perdón, la generosidad y la paz.

Esta semana, nos invito a meditar en el corazón traspasado de María. Su corazón está trabajando silenciosamente para nosotros en la Iglesia y en el mundo, exponiendo nuestros malos pensamientos y abriendo un camino para el amor divino de su hijo. Así es como ella coopera gentilmente en nuestra salvación. Los corazones cerrados son nuestro mayor problema; Los corazones traspasados por el amor son el máximo poder para superar todas las dificultades.

Question: Luke's Gospel is the only one to mention the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. What is Luke trying to communicate here and what connection does it have with Mary? And... What / Why the title of Candlemas Day?

Answer: February 2 is exactly forty days after December 25, the nativity of Jesus. Jewish law (Ex 13:2, 12) dictated that Jesus, as the firstborn, be consecrated to God.

This was done by the parents as they presented their Son in the Temple.

Jewish law further specified (Lv 12:2-8) that a mother was ritually impure after giving birth, and that she had to wait a set period of time (forty days for a boy) before she was to offer a sacrifice to the Lord for purification. The convergence of these two Jewish regulations occasions Luke's account of both the Presentation of the Lord and the Purification of Mary.

These days the liturgical emphasis is more on the Presentation of Jesus.

Luke highlights the role of Simeon and Anna, two righteous Jews who recognized Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah and praised God for being able to see and experience such a marvel in their lifetimes.

Simeon's prayer concerning the special role of Jesus states that Jesus is "a light for revelation to the Gentiles."

This phrase eventually originated the custom of blessing candles on this day which were to be used in the ceremonies, rituals, and processions throughout the church year.

Thus February 2 is also known as Candlemas Day.

This day is indeed a rich feast to be savored.
