## **Gospel Meditation:**

In my experience, one of the peculiarities of being a man is the somewhat unlikely ability to look into the mirror, no matter how out of shape he may be, and declare with full confidence: "Looking good, buddy!" Ask a man. He'll probably confirm it.

Therein lies a mystery. You might think I refer to man's ability to deceive himself or his propensity toward vainglory. But in this case, I refer to the mystery of a healthy and proper sense of self-love. We human beings (both men and women) have the utterly weird ability to look at ourselves as if we were another. Then we tend to love this "other." Then, somehow, that love becomes a bond between the two. We are three and yet one.

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday. We ponder anew that God in His unity is a play of multiplicity: Lover, Beloved, and shared Love. Or, as we also proclaim, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. If we allow it, this mystery heals our temptation toward self-hatred and destruction. We all know how awful it is to look into the mirror and not know the person we see, or, equally bad, to know and hate who we see. Jesus, the Son of God, draws us into the dynamics of authentic self-knowledge and self-love. Perhaps we could ask the Holy Trinity this Sunday to teach us to truly look at ourselves and to properly love who we see looking back.

## <u>Meditación del Evangelio:</u>

En mi experiencia, una de las peculiaridades de ser un hombre es la capacidad algo improbable de mirarse en el espejo, sin importar cuán fuera de forma pueda estar, y declarar con plena confianza: "¡Se ve bien, amigo!" Pregúntale a un hombre. Probablemente lo confirmará.

O, como también proclamamos, Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo. Si lo permitimos, este misterio sana nuestra tentación hacia el odio a nosotros mismos y la destrucción. Todos sabemos lo horrible que es mirar se en el espejo y no conocer a la persona que vemos, o, igualmente malo, saber y odiar a quién vemos. Jesús, el Hijo de Dios, nos lleva a la dinámica del auténtico autoconocimiento y del amor propio. Tal vez podríamos pedirle a la Santísima Trinidad este domingo que nos enseñe a mirarnos verdaderamente a nosotros mismos y a amar adecuadamente a quien vemos mirando hacia atrás.





Today... we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity...

Next week we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus (*Corpus Christi*)... and we celebrate Father's Day the Sunday after that.

I know I'm a bit premature on this but I want to talk a bit about Father's Day and share something with all our dads out there.

First and foremost we should *all* look to, and celebrate, our Heavenly Father (*not only on Father's Day...* every day!). Next we must celebrate and honor our own earthly father... as the Commandment says... *Honor thy Father and thy Mother*. Finally, men, we have to look at ourselves as fathers (*or simply as men*) and our roles within (*and outside of*) the family.

I hate to say this, guys... but a lot of us have kind of 'fallen down' on the job (I'm just as guilty as the next guy...).

Our traditional role is that of Head of the House (HoH) (no offense, ladies - I know many of you are also Head of the House...

Then, if married, I explain that their 'primary mission' has expanded and ask the question again. Answer: Get yourself and your spouse to heaven! Then, as a parent, I explain that their 'mission' has expanded even further and again ask the question. By this time they see where the question is heading so

they answer: Get yourself, spouse and children to heaven! BINGO!! Nothing else really matters in the long run!

Guys, we are called to set the example for our family! If, by our actions, we show that our Faith isn't that important to us... guess what... it won't be important to our spouse or children either!

We promise by our Baptismal Vows (*ours and our children's*) that we will raise them in a faith-filled environment. We want the best for our children... our spouse... for ourselves... what could possibly be better than eternal life with our loved ones?

I know this really doesn't apply to you... you're here...

But maybe you know somebody who could use the reminder. Pass it on...

Question: If it isn't only for people who are dying,

when should someone receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick?

Answer:

One of the unfortunate realities in the Church today is that so few people understand the meaning and value of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, largely because so many people still mistakenly think of this sacrament as "Last Rites" or "Extreme Unction."

In his life and ministry, Jesus healed the sick. In this sacrament, the Church continues the healing mission of Jesus and, in hope, prays that God will grant healing to the person who is suffering. But even if there is no physical healing, the sacrament offers spiritual healing through the Holy Spirit's gifts of peace and courage.

And so, anyone who is living with serious illness (including emotional or psychological illness) and the elderly are encouraged to celebrate this sacrament when it is needed.

The ritual for Anointing of the Sick does also include special prayers and blessings for those who are facing death, including viaticum (communion given to the dying, trusting that the Lord Jesus will be their companion along the way, as they make their final journey).
