Gospel Meditation:

When I was 22, I entered St. Peter's Basilica for the first time. It floored me. I could hardly take it in, its grandeur, majestic arches, vibrant colors, and the light that danced through its high windows. Somehow, amidst such splendor, I felt an overwhelming sense of belonging, as if I had finally come home.

Jesus reorients how we Catholics see sacred buildings. In today's Gospel he says,

"Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up" (John 2:13-22). His riddle implies, shockingly, that his own body is now the fundamental dwelling place of God and humanity. The temple in Jerusalem has been superseded.

In our churches today — whether they mirror the basilica's grandeur or embrace humble simplicity — we experience architectural symbols of Christ's risen body. It is no accident we call them "churches": they make visible in brick-and-mortar Christ's body which is made up of the living stones we call Christians. Each church building, like St. John Lateran in Rome, or St. Peter's, or any other, is meant to be a vibrant sign of Christ's resurrected body. We should cherish and protect our churches as places where heaven touches earth, where we, as a community, are raised to the fullness of life in Christ.

Meditación del Evangelio:

Cuando tenía 22 años, entré por primera vez en la Basílica de San Pedro. Me dejó anonadado. Apenas podía asimilarlo, su grandeza, sus majestuosos arcos, sus colores vibrantes y la luz que bailaba a través de sus altas ventanas. De alguna manera, en medio de tanto esplendor, sentí un abrumador sentido de pertenencia, como si finalmente hubiera regresado a casa.

Jesús reorienta la forma en que los católicos vemos los edificios sagrados. En el Evangelio de hoy dice: "Destruid este templo, y en tres días lo levantaré" (Juan 2:13-22). Su acertijo implica, sorprendentemente, que su propio cuerpo es ahora la morada fundamental de Dios y la humanidad. El templo de Jerusalén ha sido reemplazado.

En nuestras iglesias de hoy, ya sea que reflejen la grandeza de la basílica o adopten la humilde simplicidad, experimentamos símbolos arquitectónicos del cuerpo resucitado de Cristo. No es casualidad que las llamemos "iglesias": hacen visible en ladrillo y mortero el cuerpo de Cristo que está hecho de las piedras vivas que llamamos cristianos. Cada edificio de la iglesia, como San Juan de Letrán en Roma, o San Pedro, o cualquier otro, está destinado a ser un signo vibrante del cuerpo resucitado de Cristo. Debemos apreciar y proteger nuestras iglesias como lugares donde el cielo toca la tierra, donde nosotros, como comunidad, somos elevados a la plenitud de la vida en Cristo.



St Vincent de Paul at St. Pius X is once again collecting for its Annual Dinner Programs.



We always hear that we should pray for people... for our loved ones, especially for those who have passed. Often times people think 'Well, they're gone now... what good will it do!' The answer is... LOTS!

So, *What exactly is an Indulgence?* Well, an Indulgence is a special gift of grace granted by the Church for the remission of *temporal punishment* from sins that have been forgiven.

Remember... There are 2 parts to every sin: the 'act/sin' itself and the punishment associated with it.

If/when we commit a mortal sin we receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) to have it forgiven.

That takes care of the 'act' of the sin - it will not longer send us to hell... but the temporal punishment associated

with it remains.... So, What is Temporal Punishment? Temporal Punishment is the punishment one must go through either in Purgatory or here on earth, because of the debt to God created by sin.

It's **NOT** the same as eternal punishment... which does not end and is suffered by those in hell.

For example, Imagine you broke someone's coffee cup. You say you are sorry, ask to be forgiven, and they forgive you... but... the cup is still broken. The temporal punishment is the buying a new cup for them. An indulgence is the owner saying, "No, you don't have to."

But... I thought going to Confession meant my sins are forgiven... and wiped away!

Yes... In going to Confession, receiving absolution and performing your penance... your sins *are* forgiven and any *eternal punishment* you would have suffered is wiped away... *Thanks be to God!*

But the temporal punishment associated with it remains... and THAT is what is 'purified' in Purgatory.

So... Remind me again... Why should I care about Indulgences? Through Confession our sins are forgiven and eternal punishment is wiped away... but there is still a debt to be repaid to God's Divine Justice.

An indulgence is the payment of that debt here on earth... rather than later in Purgatory.

One of the other beautiful things about an Indulgence... is that you may use (apply) them for yourself...
 or for someone who has passed and may be in purgatory! Assigning an indulgence to a loved one who has passed

can *and will* shorten the time they spend in Purgatory! And, if they are already in heaven... it may be used for someone else. *How cool is that!!??*

There are Plenary (complete) and Partial Indulgences and they are granted for various prayers and / or acts of piety. To receive a Plenary Indulgence you must: perform a Sacramental Confession (one Sacramental Confession may be used for a number of Indulgences - as long as you are free from serious (mortal) sin), receive Holy Communion,

Pray for the Pope's intention and be free from willful attachment to sin

(difficult... yes, but not impossible. We will talk more about this later..).

How do you know when an Indulgence has been granted? You don't.

With our limited faculties, there's just no way we can know.

But, we trust in God... just as in our regular prayer life... in our heart we believe... we trust... it's our Faith... So, don't give up on indulgences just because you don't fully understand them.

Remember the Divine Mercy mantra... Jesus, I Trust in You. That's all you need.
