St Vincent de Paul at St. Pius X is once again collecting food items for its Annual Dinner Programs.



Gospel Meditation:

When I was a kid, I hated playing Monopoly because my siblings and friends always seemed to win. But worse was how it happened. Scared to risk my fake money on buying properties, I'd hold on to it. My opponents hungrily bought up the various real estate squares on the board. Then, inevitably, my poor, low-equity self would land on their spots, pay them rent, and my money would drain to zero. It seemed so unfair. The rich get richer, and the poor get poorer. I had to learn that monopoly money is meant to be spent. I was scared to lose some of it. So, I lost all of it.

How do we see what we possess? Jesus' parable about the talents is not really about economics but about the investability of everything he entrusts to us. How marvelous that everyone in the fable who places talents in the open market doubles their investment. The only one who doesn't is the man who fearfully buries his one talent. Jesus' success strategy for us seems to be, whatever we have, get it out of our possession. Risk it as quickly and as fully as we can.

You and I have precious gifts. We have valuable things to invest — time, talents, treasure. The Lord invites us to be brave and even somewhat reckless, to give as much away as possible. If we give it away in the direction of love and truth, it will grow. If we hold on to it in fear, the little we have will be taken away. Let me challenge you this week: find something in your life you're holding on to, and risk it by giving it away. It won't double if you hold on to it.

Meditación del Evangelio:

Cuando era niño, odiaba jugar al Monopoly porque mis hermanos y amigos siempre parecían ganar. Pero peor fue como sucedió. Asustado de arriesgar mi dinero falso en la compra de propiedades, me aferraba a él. Mis oponentes compraron con avidez las diversas casillas de bienes raíces en el tablero. Entonces, inevitablemente, mi yo pobre y de baja equidad aterrizaría en sus lugares, les pagaría el alquiler y mi dinero se agotaría a cero. Parecía tan injusto. Los ricos se hacen más ricos y los pobres más pobres. Tuve que aprender que el dinero de los monopolios está hecho para gastarse. Tenía miedo de perder algo de eso. Así que lo perdí todo.

¿Cómo vemos lo que poseemos? La parábola de Jesús sobre los talentos no tiene que ver realmente con la economía, sino con la capacidad de inversión de todo lo que nos confía. Qué maravilla que todos los de la fábula que colocan talentos en el mercado abierto dupliquen su inversión. El único que no lo hace es el hombre que entierra temerosamente su único talento. La estrategia de éxito de Jesús para nosotros parece ser, lo que sea que tengamos, sáquelo de nuestra posesión. Arriesgarnos lo más rápido y tan completo como podamos.

Tú y yo tenemos dones preciosos. Tenemos cosas valiosas para invertir: tiempo, talentos, tesoros. El Señor nos invita a
 ser valientes e incluso un poco temerarios, a dar todo lo posible. Si lo entregamos en la dirección del amor y la verdad, crecerá. Si nos aferramos a ella con miedo, nos quitarán lo poco que tenemos. Déjame desafiarte esta semana: encuentra algo en tu vida a lo que te aferres y arriésgate regalándolo. No se duplicará si te aferras a él.

Question: *If it isn't only for people who are dying,*

when should someone receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick?

Answer: One of the unfortunate realities in the Church today is that so few people understand the meaning and value of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, largely because so many people still mistakenly think of this sacrament as "Last Rites" or "Extreme Unction."

In his life and ministry, Jesus healed the sick. In this sacrament, the Church continues the healing mission of Jesus and, in hope, prays that God will grant healing to the person who is suffering. But even if there is no physical healing, the sacrament offers spiritual healing through the Holy Spirit's gifts of peace and courage.

And so, anyone who is living with serious illness (including emotional or psychological illness) and the elderly are encouraged to celebrate this sacrament when it is needed.

The ritual for Anointing of the Sick does also include special prayers and blessings for those who are facing death, including viaticum (communion given to the dying, trusting that the Lord Jesus will be their companion along the way, as they make their final journey).


