

Gospel Meditation:

When I was a kid growing up in New England, I'd occasionally go on a whale watch.

Once we went out with calm waters and clear skies. But on the way back in, the sea got rough.

I was just a kid, and I remember thinking we should turn left or right toward the shoreline I could see.

But the pilot of the boat kept going straight — right into the waves — focused on a small, discouragingly distant lighthouse. Even when it flickered in and out of sight, he stayed the course. He knew where he was going.

That image comes to mind when I hear Jesus' words in today's Gospel regarding false messiahs:

"Do not follow them" (Luke 21:8). In times of chaos or uncertainty, there are always voices offering easier routes, promising false safety, claiming to speak for God. But Jesus isn't found in the loudest voice or the nearest shoreline. He is steady, like a lighthouse in the storm.

The tribulation of which Jesus speaks — it's real. It happened to the Temple, it happened to him, it happens in the Church, and it will come to each of us. But the command is not to panic. It's to endure.

To keep steering toward him. Faith isn't about having all the answers or dodging every wave.

It's about knowing where the lighthouse is — and trusting it enough to keep going, especially when false safety beckons us to stop.

Meditación del Evangelio:

Cuando era un niño que crecía en Nueva Inglaterra, ocasionalmente iba a observar ballenas.

Una vez salimos con aguas tranquilas y cielos despejados. Pero en el camino de regreso, el mar se puso agitado. Yo era solo un niño y recuerdo haber pensado que deberíamos girar a la izquierda o a la derecha hacia la costa que podía ver. Pero el piloto del bote siguió adelante, directamente hacia las olas, concentrado en un faro pequeño y desalentadoramente distante. Incluso cuando parpadeaba dentro y fuera de la vista, mantuvo el rumbo. Sabía a dónde iba.

Esa imagen me viene a la mente cuando escucho las palabras de Jesús en el Evangelio de hoy con respecto a los falsos mesías: "*No los sigáis*" (*Lucas 21:8*). En tiempos de caos o incertidumbre, siempre hay voces que ofrecen rutas más fáciles, prometiendo falsa seguridad, afirmando hablar por Dios. Pero Jesús no se encuentra en la voz más fuerte o en la costa más cercana. Es firme, como un faro en la tormenta.

La tribulación de la que habla Jesús, es real. Le sucedió al Templo, le sucedió a él, sucede en la Iglesia y nos llegará a cada uno de nosotros. Pero el mandato es no entrar en pánico. Es para perdurar.

Seguir dirigiéndose hacia él. La fe no se trata de tener todas las respuestas o esquivar cada ola.

Se trata de saber dónde está el faro y confiar en él lo suficiente como para seguir adelante,

especialmente cuando la falsa seguridad nos invita a detenernos.

Question: Why do Catholics call priests Father... when Jesus said not to?

Maswer: One of the common objections evangelical Christians have to Catholics is our practice of calling priests by the title Father. They will often cite a passage in Matthew's Gospel in which Jesus tells his followers: "Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven" (23:19).

It seems pretty straightforward, but when we put this verse in context, we see that Jesus is speaking out against religious leaders who had forgotten what their proper role was and who were bad examples through their own hypocrisy and elitist attitudes.

In other Gospels, we find Jesus himself using the title father for different characters, such as in the Parable of Lazarus and the Rich Man (Luke 16:19-31]) and the Parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32). If we put the verse from Matthew into the full scope of Jesus' teachings, he isn't saying that we can't use words like "father," "rabbi," or "master." Rather, he is telling us that we should be mindful of the full meaning of those titles and not to misuse them.

To call a priest "Father" is more than a sign of respect for the office of the priesthood. It goes all the way back to the way St. Paul understood his own work as a missionary and evangelizer. Paul wrote, "I am writing you in this way not to shame you but to admonish you as my beloved children ... It was I who begot you in Christ Jesus through my preaching of the Gospel. I beg you, then, be imitators of me. This is why I have sent you Timothy, my beloved and faithful son in the Lord" (1 Corinthians 4:14-17).

Yes, we have God alone as our heavenly Father, but there are also those here with us who nurture and nourish our faith through their teaching and care. This is why the title of Father has been applied to the church's pastors in different ways since the earliest days of the Church, including monks and nuns using the title "abbot" and "abbess" (from abba) for their spiritual leaders and Christians around the world recognizing the "Holy Father" or "pope" (from papa) as the head of the family that is the Church.

The title Father is a reminder that priests have a special responsibility to care for, protect, feed, listen to, and nourish those who have been entrusted to them, all after the example of our Father in heaven who never ceases to give us what we truly need.


