# Gospel Meditation:

Our culture seems more polarized and divided than ever. Into this wounded situation, our Catholic faith has a healing remedy to offer: the gift of wisdom. When the Lord offers to give King Solomon anything the monarch desires, he requests "an understanding heart" (1 Kings 3:9). In his polarized situation, the King doesn't ask for power to defeat his enemies. He asks for a wise and understanding heart to judge right from wrong. This wisdom is elevated and fulfilled in Jesus who teaches us to bring forth "both the new and the old" (Matthew 13:52).

In our fractured society, we Christians should stop pining for political power to crush our perceived enemies. That often just makes things worse. Rather, it's much more useful to beg for the grace of true wisdom which transcends both sides of the aisle. This places us in a fresh position from which we can help our culture see what is true and good all across the ideological spectrum. Sometimes we'll look like liberals (e.g., in our love for the poor and marginalized) and other times like conservatives (e.g., in our sexual ethics and views on religious freedom). Because this wisdom is free from ideological narrowness, it will help to heal these painful fractures. Lord Jesus, this week, pour into us your healing wisdom.

# Meditación del Evangelio:

Nuestra cultura parece más polarizada y dividida que nunca. En esta situación herida, nuestra fe católica tiene un remedio curativo que ofrecer: el don de la sabiduría. Cuando el Señor ofrece darle al rey Salomón cualquier cosa que el monarca desee, pide "un corazón comprensivo" (1 Reyes 3:9). En su situación polarizada, el Rey no pide poder para derrotar a sus enemigos. Pide un corazón sabio y comprensivo para juzgar el bien del mal. Esta sabiduría se eleva y se cumple en Jesús, quien nos enseña a dar a luz "tanto lo nuevo como lo viejo" (Mateo 13:52).

En nuestra sociedad fracturada, los cristianos debemos dejar de anhelar el poder político para aplastar a nuestros enemigos percibidos. Eso a menudo solo empeora las cosas. Más bien, es mucho más útil suplicar por la gracia de la verdadera sabiduría que trasciende ambos lados del pasillo. Esto nos coloca en una nueva posición desde la cual podemos ayudar a nuestra cultura a ver lo que es verdadero y bueno en todo el espectro ideológico. A veces nos veremos como liberales (por ejemplo, en nuestro amor por los pobres y marginados) y otras veces como conservadores (por ejemplo, en nuestra ética sexual y puntos de vista sobre la libertad religiosa). Debido a que esta sabiduría está libre de estrechez ideológica, ayudará a sanar estas dolorosas fracturas. Señor Jesús, esta semana, derrama en nosotros tu sabiduría sanadora.

#### DEACON'S CORNER / Side-Bar: What We Believe: -

We should all know this... but... I don't think everyone does. So, bear with me. If you would like to delve into this or any other topic more deeply... contact Fr Mike or one of your Deacons.

First and foremost... and paramount to our faith is the concept of the '*Real Presence*...' The fact that the hosts and cup(s) of wine are changed during their consecration into the Body and Blood of Our Lord, Jesus Christ himself!

They are not simply 'symbolic reminders' of Him.
They **ARE**, in fact, the body and blood of Christ! Unfortunately, some of our more '*intellectual??*' brothers and sisters have decided that Christ's words and 2000 years of Tradition (*remember the Capital-T means Teaching from the Apostles*) were wrong...

When Jesus gave His Bread of Life Discourse (John 6) and said that His body was real food and his blood true drink... and we must eat and drink of it... and many of His disciples left him because what he was saying was 'too hard...' They know that Jesus really chased after them and told them... I'm sorry... I was speaking figuratively... when I speak of my flesh and blood... change that to bread and wine... as long as you think of me when you eat and drink it!

They figure some Catholic probably changed a sentence or two to make our version of the story the final one. <u>WRONG</u>! Jesus was speaking literally... during his Bread of Life Discourse he told his disciples what he was going to do... and when they left because it was too hard, he let them go and asked the 12, "Do you also want to leave?" He was not backing down or watering down what he was saying! Then, finally, at the Last Supper Jesus GAVE them His Body (in the bread) and His Blood (in the cup). But, They know what Jesus really meant when he said 'This is my body...' and 'This is my blood...' He meant to say... 'Think of this bread as my body... think of this wine as my blood...' WRONG – Again! He said, "This IS my blood."

And, when we receive the Eucharist... the minister says "The Body / Blood of Christ..." not "THIS IS the body/blood of Christ." The statement is purposely a little vague... because Christ, present in the eucharistic elements, is also now really present in the person receiving communion... and we are sent to bring Him into the world. We have to get back to our Faith! We have to believe! He is REAL... he is PRESENT! How sad for those who don't believe... instead of kneeling in adoration before Our Lord and God, Jesus Christ present in the Blessed Sacrament... they might just as well sitting at HEB, aisle 4... in the Saltine section! I know this doesn't 'clear up' this mystery... but then again I'm only a deacon... I'll understand it better the same time you do... when we meet with Our Lord in eternity.

Until then I'll accept it on faith and do the best I can. God Bless- DT
