Gospel Meditation:

When I was a young boy, my parents told me about their wedding.

Then a few years later, they showed me my mother's wedding dress and my dad's suit. It was astonishing to see and touch garments that connected me to the event that led to my existence.

Of course, I already believed they were married based on their word. But these holy garments made the event real and tangible for me.

Something like this is at play when St. John reports encountering in Jesus' tomb, "the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place" (John 20:7). Those two separate cloths, for his head and for his body respectively, meant a great deal to St. John and to the early Christians. Some years after the resurrection, there surfaced reports of two cloths with unusual characteristics, one bearing the image of a crucified man's body, another smaller one with the image of a wounded man's face.

Some call them the Shroud of Turin and the Veil of Manoppello; they both can be seen today.

These two cloths have a long and complicated history, and scholars debate aspects of them.

If you're curious, I encourage you to read about them. To be clear, I believe in the resurrection of Jesus because of the testimony of eyewitnesses and the gift of faith in the Church. Nevertheless, seeing these two mysterious cloths have made the life-giving event of Jesus' resurrection more real and tangible for me. Maybe they will for you, too.

Meditación del Evangelio:

Cuando era niño, mis padres me hablaron de su boda. Luego, unos años más tarde, me mostraron el vestido de novia de mi madre y el traje de mi padre. Fue asombroso ver y tocar prendas que me conectaron con el evento que me llevó a mi existencia. Por supuesto, ya creía que estaban casados según su palabra. Pero estas vestiduras sagradas hicieron que el evento fuera real y tangible para mí.

Algo así está en juego cuando San Juan informa haber encontrado en la tumba de Jesús, "el lienzo que había cubierto su cabeza, no con los lienzos de la sepultura, sino enrollado en un lugar aparte" (Juan 20:7). Esas dos telas separadas, para su cabeza y para su cuerpo respectivamente, significaban mucho para San Juan y para los primeros cristianos. Algunos años después de la resurrección, surgieron informes de dos telas con características inusuales, una con la imagen del cuerpo de un hombre crucificado, otra más pequeña con la imagen del rostro de un hombre herido. Algunos los llaman la Sábana Santa de Turín y el Velo de Manoppello; Ambos se pueden ver hoy en día.

Estas dos telas tienen una larga y complicada historia, y los estudiosos debaten aspectos de ellas. Si tienes curiosidad, te animo a que leas sobre ellos. Para ser claros, creo en la resurrección de Jesús debido al testimonio de testigos oculares y el don de la fe en la Iglesia. Sin embargo, ver estas dos telas misteriosas ha hecho que el evento vivificante de la resurrección de Jesús sea más real y tangible para mí. Tal vez también lo hagan para ti.

Question: How do I discern if a call to do something big is really from God?

<u>Answer:</u> Each day we face plenty of decisions about following God: whether or not to pray, how to treat people, how to prioritize our time, etc. Sometimes there can be something much more significant we discern: a vocational call, a promotion at work that requires a move, or a new ministry position at church. In addition to a pro-con list or a cost-benefit analysis, here are a few things to prayerfully consider and to talk over with trusted individuals.

Does it conform to God's will? God doesn't call us to do something that contradicts the moral law.

Will it encourage spiritual growth? Sometimes we need to choose between multiple good options. Consider the personal impact on you and others you are responsible for, like family.

Other times we might be invited to do good for others, but when we assess our other life commitments, we see that saying yes to this would actually impede our prior responsibilities in the long run.

Does the call seem consistent? This isn't to say that God won't do something new. Consider if the call is consistent with your gifts and abilities. Can you see a "through-line" so to speak, with how your experiences have led you to this point?

Do others confirm it? Share your reflections with trusted, insightful confidantes. Have they seen the same things you have, or are they bringing up new points to consider? Humbly add their relevant points to your considerations.

Don't forget your gut. After you've carefully considered everything in your mind, don't neglect your instincts.

Does your heart say yes or no?


