Gospel Meditation:

I am amazed at how my four siblings teach their many kids in age-appropriate ways.

For example, now that my nephew Brandon is 24 years of age, they give him insights and freedoms that would have been positively confounding or even dangerous when he was a toddler. Imagine if they had taught him at age four how to drive a car, use a credit card online, or handle power tools. But eventually, they did, and he is a high functioning young man, I'm proud to say. They are good teachers.

This week we learn that Jesus teaches us in a similar way. He says to his Apostles, "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now" (John 16:12). How disappointing for them. But imagine at that moment, before his resurrection and ascension, if the Lord had started telling them about synods and sacraments, popes and parishes, martyrs and monasteries, rosaries and relics, catechisms and crucifixes? They would have been absolutely overwhelmed, confused, and discouraged. He tells them what they need to know, when it is time for them to know it.

So he does for us. Jesus has unceasingly taught the Church as she matures through the centuries, just as he teaches you and me through our lives in ways we can understand. Our task should be to learn what he is teaching us now, knowing that (although revelation per se is complete in him and his Apostles), he never ceases to teach us as we spiritually mature. Be confident: he knows what you are ready to learn now.

<u>Meditación del Evangelio:</u>

Me sorprende cómo mis cuatro hermanos enseñan a sus muchos hijos de maneras apropiadas para su edad. Por ejemplo, ahora que mi sobrino Brandon tiene 24 años, le dan ideas y libertades que habrían sido positivamente confusas o incluso peligrosas cuando era un niño pequeño. Imagínese si le hubieran enseñado a los cuatro años a conducir un automóvil, usar una tarjeta de crédito en línea o manejar herramientas eléctricas. Pero finalmente, lo hicieron, y me enorgullece decir que es un joven de alto funcionamiento. Son buenos maestros.

Esta semana aprendemos que Jesús nos enseña de una manera similar. Él dice a sus apóstoles: "Tengo mucho más que deciros, pero ahora no podéis soportarlo" (Juan 16:12). Qué decepción para ellos. Pero imagínense en ese momento, antes de su resurrección y ascensión, si el Señor hubiera empezado a hablarles de sínodos y sacramentos, papas y parroquias, mártires y monasterios, rosarios y reliquias, catecismos y crucifijos. Se habrían sentido absolutamente abrumados, confundidos y desanimados. El les dice lo que necesitan saber, cuando es el momento de que lo sepan.

Así lo hace por nosotros. Jesús ha enseñado incesantemente a la Iglesia a medida que madura a través de los siglos, así como nos enseña a ti y a mí a través de nuestras vidas de maneras que podemos entender. Nuestra tarea debe ser aprender lo que él nos está enseñando ahora, sabiendo que (aunque la revelación per se es completa en él y en sus apóstoles), él nunca deja de enseñarnos a medida que maduramos espiritualmente. Ten confianza: él sabe lo que estás listo para aprender ahora.

Today... we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity... and we celebrate Father's Day. Not to downgrade the importance of... and our love of the Most Holy Trinity... but I'd want to talk a bit about Father's Day and share something with our dads out there.

First and foremost we should **all** look to, and celebrate, our Heavenly Father (not only on Father's Day... every day!). Next we must celebrate and honor our own earthly father... as the Commandment says...

Honor thy Father and thy Mother. Finally, men, we have to look at ourselves as fathers (or simply as men) and our roles within (and outside of) the family.

I hate to say this, guys... but a lot of us have kind of 'fallen down' on the job (I'm just as guilty as the next guy...).

Our traditional role is that of Head of the House (HoH) (no offense, ladies - I know many of you are also Head of the House .. that's why I said 'traditional'). Being HoH means more than just 'bringing home the bacon!'

In addition to caring for the family's physical needs it means, and in my mind more importantly, caring for your family's *spiritual needs*!

If any of you have ever been to one of my Baptism-Preparation sessions you've heard me ask what a persons 'primary mission in life is.'... Answer: Get to heaven! Then, if married, I explain that their 'primary mission' has expanded and ask the question again. Answer: Get yourself and your spouse to heaven! Then, as a parent, I explain that their 'mission' has expanded even further and again ask the question. By this time they see where the question is heading so they answer: Get yourself, spouse and children to heaven! BINGO!! Nothing else really matters in the long run!

Guys, we are called to set the example for our family!

If, by our actions, we show that our Faith isn't that important to us... guess what... it won't be important to our spouse or children either! It's simple enough... "What's important to us... will be important to them!"

We promise by our Baptismal Vows (ours and our children's) that we will raise them in a faith-filled environment.


We want the best for our children... our spouse... for ourselves... what could possibly be better than eternal life with our loved ones?

Matrimony – Marriage Preparation should begin at least 6 months prior to the proposed wedding date. At least 1 of the parties must be a member of STM or there must be a strong tie to the parish. If baptized, each party must provide a currently-issued (within the prior 6 months) Baptismal Certificate. The process begins with an interview with the pastor or his delegate where much of the preliminary paperwork is completed.

Impediments-to-Marriage (eg. Prior bond or other sanction by either party) must be 'cleared' before the marriage can take place. Assuming there are no impediments... the couple is assigned a Couples-Sponsor with whom they will meet several times prior to the wedding date. These meetings will help in organizing and planning this special day and help allay any fears and dispel many problems or confusion that may otherwise arise. The couples-sponsors are available from the date of assignment thru the wedding itself.

The couple must also meet the Archdiocesan marriage preparation requirements by either attending classes covering Evangelization and Christian Discipleship as Vocation, the Rite of Marriage, and Christian Marriage Life Skills; or they may opt to attend a weekend Marriage Preparation Retreat covering the same topics.


