# **Gospel Meditation:**

What are you supposed to do about the bad behavior of the people around you?

You know who I'm talking about. That family member, friend, coworker, or acquaintance who is quite immoral. On this front there are two lively options in our culture: bash the person to others (probably online) or pretend everything's fine. The former damages the person. The latter ignores reality. What to do?

Jesus' strategy in the Gospel of Matthew is as wise as it is difficult: go directly to the person, and then gradually expand the circle of intervention. Simple, often effective, and hard. But what we often miss is the context of the Lord's strategy, "If your brother sins against you..." Notice the italicized words. Is the person in a Christian familial bond with you? And was the action in question against you? If so, proceed with the plan. Fine. But how often we fret over the sins of those who either aren't our spiritual siblings or have done nothing directly to us. This is not an invitation to ignore injustice in the world. Rather, we should build bonds of fraternal love, and carefully discern when and how others' sins are indeed our concern. Sometimes they are. Other times — frequently, perhaps — they simply are not.

# Meditación del Evangelio:

¿Qué se supone que debes hacer con el mal comportamiento de las personas que te rodean? Sabes de quién estoy hablando. Ese miembro de la familia, amigo, compañero de trabajo o conocido que es bastante inmoral. En este frente hay dos opciones animadas en nuestra cultura: golpear a la persona a los demás (probablemente en línea) o fingir que todo está bien.

El primero daña a la persona. Este último ignora la realidad. ¿Qué hacer?

La estrategia de Jesús en el Evangelio de Mateo es tan sabia como difícil: ir directamente a la persona, y luego ampliar gradualmente el círculo de intervención. Simple, a menudo efectivo y difícil. Pero lo que a menudo pasamos por alto es el contexto de la estrategia del Señor: "Si tu hermano peca contra ti..." Observe las palabras en cursiva. ¿Está la persona en un vínculo familiar cristiano contigo? ¿Y fue la acción en cuestión contra usted? Si es así, proceda con el plan. Multa. Pero con qué frecuencia nos preocupamos por los pecados de aquellos que no son nuestros hermanos espirituales o que no nos han hecho nada directamente. Esto no es una invitación a ignorar la injusticia en el mundo. Más bien, debemos construir lazos de amor fraterno y discernir cuidadosamente cuándo y cómo los pecados de los demás son realmente nuestra preocupación. A veces lo son. Otras veces, con frecuencia, tal vez, simplemente no lo son.

Question:

After a civil divorce, is a Catholic obligated to pursue an annulment?

Answer:

Many Catholics are not exactly sure what an annulment does.

An annulment does not deny that a marriage took place, nor does it deny that there once was love. It does not mean that people say anything untrue, such as they never loved each other or that everything in their marriage was wrong. An annulment does not negate children, nor make them illegitimate.

An annulment addresses the spiritual aspect of marriage.

In effect, an annulment says that at the time of the wedding, there was either something present or something absent that prevented the sacrament from taking place. It is a spiritual determination that, if granted in the affirmative, allows a person to marry in the Church.

Annulments have no legal standing and are unable to be used in a civil court.

Therefore, a Catholic has no moral obligation to pursue an annulment. However, when the tragedy of divorce occurs, and there is no hope for reconciliation, annulments may help bring some spiritual closure to a person's life. Some people have found the process to be healing and others have found it to be difficult. Speak to your priest or a member of the Diocesan Tribunal staff to decide what is best for you.
