### **Gospel Meditation:**

"As he rode along, the people were spreading their cloaks on the road." (Luke 19:36)

Consider how useless it is to spread your clothes on the ground for a donkey to walk on. The clothes get smeared with hooves, and who knows the grimy places where they've been? The animal may leave some unsavory presents on them. They may get stolen by a thief looking to make a buck. The thorns, thistles, rocks and muck of the road will leave stains. The clothes may never be useful again, and you'll probably walk home shivering without your normal covering. Yet this is precisely the gesture the people employ to welcome Jesus and his donkey. Why does this detail matter?

Wastefulness is an essential part of celebration. Consider the unnecessary extravagance of Christmas decorations, confetti and ticker tape parades, baseball players spraying each other with bottles of champagne after a victory, birthday gifts for kids and so on. This wastefulness signals celebration and therefore participation in higher identities (as believers, winners, and parents, to mention the above examples). That's what the wasted cloaks are all about. Those who donate their cloaks participate in Christ's kingship in Jerusalem - and we savor it two thousand years later.

The lesson? Learn how to "waste" money, time, clothes, and food on Christ.

We do this at Mass, but in so many other ways, too, like serving the poor, going on retreats, and doing prayerful study. When we practice this holy wastefulness, Jesus will ride into our lives and we'll be more deeply members of his kingdom.

### Meditación del Evangelio:

"A medida que él cabalgaba, la gente extendía sus mantos en el camino". (Lucas 19:36.)

Piensa en lo inútil que es extender tu ropa en el suelo para que un burro camine sobre ella. La ropa se mancha con pezuñas, y ¿quién sabe los lugares mugrientos donde han estado? El animal puede dejar algunos regalos desagradables en ellos. Pueden ser robados por un ladrón que busca ganar dinero. Las espinas, los cardos, las rocas y el lodo del camino dejarán manchas. Es posible que la ropa nunca vuelva a ser útil, y probablemente regresará a casa temblando sin su cubierta normal. Sin embargo, este es precisamente el gesto que la gente emplea para acoger a Jesús y a su burro. ¿Por qué es importante este detalle?

El despilfarro es una parte esencial de la celebración. Considere la extravagancia innecesaria de las decoraciones navideñas, los desfiles de confeti y cintas de teletipo, los jugadores de béisbol rociándose unos a otros con botellas de champán después de una victoria, los regalos de cumpleaños para los niños, etc. Este despilfarro señala la celebración y, por lo tanto, la participación en identidades superiores (como creyentes, ganadores y padres, por mencionar los ejemplos anteriores). De eso se tratan las capas desperdiciadas. Aquellos que donan sus mantos participan en el reinado de Cristo en Jerusalén, y lo saboreamos dos mil años después.

¿La lección? Aprenda a "desperdiciar" dinero, tiempo, ropa y comida en Cristo. Hacemos esto en la Misa, pero también de muchas otras maneras, como servir a los pobres, ir a retiros y hacer estudio en oración. Cuando practiquemos este santo despilfarro, Jesús entrará en nuestras vidas y seremos miembros más profundamente de su reino.

**DIVINE MERCY NOVENA:** Easter, our holiest day of the year, is almost upon us! I don't want to belittle its importance, but I'm going to fast-forward to the next Sunday... Mercy Sunday.

A special day... Where we have an opportunity to remove all punishment due for forgiven sins!

With this devotion... we celebrate Jesus' Divine Mercy... I don't think it's a coincidence that Jesus asked for the inscription "Jesus, I Trust in You" to be put on his image of Divine Mercy...

He asked that the Feast of the Divine Mercy be preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy.

Our Lord Jesus gave St. Faustina an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena.

In her Diary, St. Faustina wrote that Jesus told her: "On each day of the novena you will bring to My heart a different group of souls and you will Immerse them in this ocean of My mercy...

On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces for these souls."

Jesus' revelation to St. Faustina comes under the heading of *Private Revelation*... and as such we, the faithful, are not bound to accept them. But, with the Divine Mercy... Graces flow every time we say the Chaplet... for ourselves... our loved ones... and others! Many people pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy daily... But, as I said...

St. Faustina's revelation is not dogma... and we are not required by Church to accept it...

Jesus asked that a Novena to His Divine Mercy be said beginning on Good Friday asking for certain souls to be brought into His merciful heart! As recorded by St. Faustina:

On Day 2 Jesus asks- "Bring to Me the Souls of Priests and Religious...

It was they who gave Me strength to endure My bitter Passion. Through them My mercy flows out upon mankind." Fr. Ed... all priests, deacons, and religious benefit from this intercession... and

On Day 7 He asks - "Bring to Me The Souls Who Especially Venerate and Glorify My Mercy...

Not one of them will go into the fire of hell. I shall particularly defend each one of them at the hour of death." What a promise to those who are true believers...

Those are just a couple of the Novena intentions... Consider the Chaplet, the Devotion, itself and Jesus' promises to those who say the Chaplet! In St Faustina's notes we read that:"... *Through the Chaplet you will obtain everything... if what you ask for is compatible My will!*" What a promise! We can pray for anything! And... as long as it is line with God's will for us... for our salvation... it will be given to us! Now, I'm not saying you'll change history... but you may be able to influence someone's heart at the moment of their death and save them from eternal damnation. (past... present... future... it's all in God's time... the 'ETERNAL NOW')

We have His promise that He will be there at our side... or the side of whomever we are praying for at their death... Not as a Judge... as we deserve... but as our Merciful Savior. He will be there offering salvation – no matter how dark our sins! We, of course, have free-will. We have the option of accepting – or rejecting – His Divine Mercy...

So... I have to ask you... Will you take advantage of these graces? Do you believe? Do you Trust? Ask yourself... how can I more fully Believe... without seeing? Ask yourself... Do I Trust... really Trust... in Jesus?

I invite you to join us as we pray the Novena to the Divine Mercy.

We will begin the Novena on Good Friday, April 18<sup>th</sup>, and it will end on the Day Before Mercy Sunday.

We will meet in the Church each day at 5 or 5:30 pm except on the last day (April 26<sup>th</sup>) when we will meet at 4 pm. Novena pamphlets will be available at the Church.
