Gospel Meditation:

Of all Jesus' miracles, the most unsettling might be when he made a dead person alive. We know of three times when he did so: a girl, a young man, and Lazarus. The miracle teaches us he has the power of life and death. He anticipates his resurrection. Sin hurts us. Some sin kills us, spiritually. The three miracles reveal to us that no matter our circumstances, Jesus can give life to us.

The three miracles are instructive of the three ways we feel dead. The little dead girl symbolizes sin before it has time to mature. She's in bed and, once alive, gets right back to her life. The young man is lying in his casket in a funeral procession. This is sin allowed to fester, to grow and become somewhat normalized. Once raised, he has a short walk back home. Lazarus, a full-grown dead man, lies wrapped in burial bands in the tomb. Once he is raised, much needs to be done. He'll need to remove those bands, find new clothes, and travel all the way back home. That is sin allowed to go all the way, unchecked for months or years. It's the most spectacular of the three and reveals Jesus' glory more than the others.

What hope that should give us, for us and those whom we love! Jesus knows our sin hurts us and can even kill us spiritually. No matter the extent of the damage, he is always ready for the miracle of making the dead fully alive.

Meditación del Evangelio:

De todos los milagros de Jesús, el más inquietante podría ser cuando dio vida a una persona muerta. Sabemos de tres veces cuando lo hizo: una niña, un joven y Lázaro. El milagro nos enseña que tiene el poder de la vida y la muerte. Él anticipa su resurrección. El pecado nos duele. Algunos pecados nos matan, espiritualmente. Los tres milagros nos revelan que no importa nuestras circunstancias, Jesús puede darnos vida.

Los tres milagros son instructivos de las tres formas en que nos sentimos muertos. La niña muerta simboliza el pecado antes de que tenga tiempo de madurar. Está en la cama y, una vez viva, vuelve a su vida. El joven yace en su ataúd en una procesión fúnebre. Este es el pecado que se permite que se infecte, crezca y se normalice un poco. Una vez criado, tiene un corto paseo de regreso a casa. Lázaro, un hombre muerto adulto, yace envuelto en bandas funerarias en la tumba. Una vez que se levanta, queda mucho por hacer. Tendrá que quitarse esas bandas, encontrar ropa nueva y viajar todo el camino de regreso a casa. Ese es el pecado permitido para ir hasta el final, sin control durante meses o años. Es el más espectacular de los tres y revela la gloria de Jesús más que los demás.

¡Qué esperanza debería darnos eso, para nosotros y para aquellos a quienes amamos! Jesús sabe que nuestro pecado nos lastima e incluso puede matarnos espiritualmente. No importa la magnitud del daño, siempre está listo para el milagro de hacer que los muertos estén completamente vivos. .



To Continue our discusión...

O: Why do we "have to" to to Mass?

We know that going to Mass is a Good thing... but, we can talk ourselves out of going by focusing on the negatives! At first we may feel a little guilty but eventually we can justify our decision by convincing ourselves that we are just too busy... too tired... to bored... or too frustrated. When that happens, we miss the great gift that God gives to us in the Eucharist.

But... What if we changed our attitude... our mind-set... about going to Mass?

What if we begin to think of Mass as the time of the day when we can connect with God and others in a special way? What if we concentrate on the things we like about our Parish instead of what we don't like? What if we make Mass a priority?

The effects of these kinds of positive attitudes may surprise you.

Research studies show that people who regularly participate in the Mass are:

- Less likely to suffer from depression,
- Less likely to abuse drugs or alcohol,
- More likely to have a solid sense of right and wrong,
- More likely to live a longer and happier life.

To reiterate... Some Good reasons to go to Mass:

- God asks us to make one day holy! God asks us to set aside one day to refocus physically, mentally and spiritually. We live in a secular world. Going to Mass helps us to see everything from a different perspective. We begin to see in the depths of our being that God is in charge. We can let go of our own agenda because we know that God will inspire us, guide us, and strengthen us for the week ahead.
- We need to experience something BIGGER than ourselves. When we go to Mass, we share in the death and resurrection of Our Lord! When we offer our ordinary lives to God through Jesus, we enter into God's great plan for the world! We are strengthened by the Eucharist and sent out into the world to bring the Gospel message to all people. The Mass gives meaning and purpose to our lives. It gives us a sense of destiny and offers the kind of peace that the world cannot give. It helps us develop a sense of wonder and awe! It helps us to see that there is something BIGGER than ourselves.
- Jesus gives us the gift of himself. When we go to Mass, we are doing what He commanded his followers to do. It is a command to love and to be loved by God. Jesus offers Himself to us in the Word of God that we hear and in His Real Presence, offered to us in the Blessed Sacrament at Communion
- We need to be part of a community. When we come together at Mass to pray and worship God, we fulfill a deep need inside us to be in communion with other people. The other parishioners even if we don't know all of them give us support, affirmation, and encouragement in our attempt to live the Gospel message. They help us to see that we are not alone. They remind us that we are all part of the Body of Christ.
- God has a special message for us! When we listen to the readings, the homily and the prayers of the Mass, God speaks to us in a special way. We should come away from each Mass with at least one inspiration that will impact our lives in some way. We just have to pay attention and be open to that the Lord is trying to tell us.

There are hundreds of other reasons to attend / participate-in Mass. These are just a few... I'd be interested in hearing yours.


