
Welcome to St. Thomas More Catholic Church

Gospel Meditation:

"The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle" (*John 8:3*). Why do they make her stand in the middle? Why not expose her on the periphery? The reason is something that affects us practically every day.

The center is what stabilizes a community's identity. We humans tend to center ourselves around an accused and condemned victim — though we rarely admit it. This renews our fragile communities and our power as those who weaponize the accusation. This is effective because it is often a victim who represents something truly dangerous for the group. In this case, adultery stands for the breakdown of a community and those within it, because it forces questions like: who is my father? Whose child is this? Is this child one of us, or that of an outsider? The accusers place the adulteress in the center because their community, like most, is built around turning an enemy into a victim.

Once you understand this, you'll see it almost anywhere humans group together (families, politics, workplaces, sports, schools, etc.). The good news is Jesus exposes this dynamic by deftly pointing out the sin-infected hearts of everyone besides the woman. They all leave, symbolizing the breakdown of the old order, and she is "left alone before him." A new community has begun, structured around the merciful love of Christ.

What is in your center? What is in the center of our parish and family communities? Strive to center on Christ's forgiveness, and we experience the new, lasting community we call the Church.

<u>Meditación del Evangelio:</u>

"Los escribas y los fariseos trajeron a una mujer que había sido sorprendida en adulterio, y la pusieron en medio" (Juan 8:3). ¿Por qué la hacen estar en el medio? ¿Por qué no exponerla en la periferia? La razón es algo que nos afecta prácticamente todos los días.

El centro es lo que estabiliza la identidad de una comunidad. Los seres humanos tendemos a centrarnos en una víctima acusada y condenada, aunque rara vez lo admitimos. Esto renueva nuestras frágiles comunidades y nuestro poder como aquellos que utilizan la acusación como arma. Esto es efectivo porque a menudo se trata de una víctima que representa algo verdaderamente peligroso para el grupo. En este caso, el adulterio representa la ruptura de una comunidad y de quienes la integran, porque obliga a preguntas como: ¿quién es mi padre? ¿De quién es este hijo? ¿Es este niño uno de nosotros, o el de un extraño? Los acusadores colocan a la adúltera en el centro porque su comunidad, como la mayoría, se basa en convertir a un enemigo en una víctima.

Una vez que entiendas esto, lo verás en casi cualquier lugar donde los humanos se agrupen (familias, política, lugares de trabajo, deportes, escuelas, etc.). La buena noticia es que Jesús expone esta dinámica al señalar hábilmente los corazones infectados por el pecado de todos además de la mujer. Todos se van, simbolizando la ruptura del viejo orden, y ella queda "sola ante él". Ha comenzado una nueva comunidad, estructurada en torno al amor misericordioso de Cristo.



A "BLAST From the Past" - the Miraculous Medal

One of our Parishioners was asking about something we "discussed" a while back.

I thought it might be a good time to refresh some memories... just in case you forgot... lol~! I know many of you are aware of this devotion...

I've seen a number of parishioners wearing the Miraculous Medal... I have one myself... and I have a large one hanging by my office door.

But I also know that many people, while they may have heard the title, 'Miraculous Medal', don't really know that much about it. Likewise, some may wear the medal simply as jewelry and may not know or understand its significance. So, I thought I'd take a minute or two today and share its background.

The Miraculous Medal goes back to July of 1830; and to Paris, France.

A young religious, Catherine, (now Saint), Labouré of the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul, was awakened on the night of July 18th by the voice of a child calling her to the sisters' chapel (located in the Rue du Bac, Paris).

She went to the chapel and heard the Blessed Virgin Mary say to her, "God wishes to charge you with a mission. You will be contradicted, but do not fear; you will have the grace to do what is necessary. Tell your spiritual director all that passes within you. Times are evil in France and in the world."

On November 27th the Blessed Mother returned. She displayed herself to Catherine inside an oval frame, standing upon a globe wearing rings of many colors. Around the margin of the frame the words "O Mary, Conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee" appeared. As she (Catherine) watched, the frame rotated showing a circle of 12 stars, a large letter 'M' surmounted by a cross with a crossbar beneath it.

Under all was an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus – crowned with thorns, and an image of the Immaculate Heart of Mary – pierced with a sword (as prophesied by Simeon).

Her fingers each had three rings and the largest stones emitted the most brilliant rays over the globe.

Catherine noticed that some of the gems did not give off rays. When asked, Our Lady explained that the rays were symbols of the graces which would be bestowed on all who asked for them... those with no rays symbolized those graces for which people do not ask.

A command was given to have a medal struck after the model revealed, and a promise of great graces was made to those who wear it when blessed. After 2 years of careful investigation, and with the approval of the Archbishop of Paris, the first medals were struck in June of 1832. The devotion spread rapidly.

There are literally hundreds – if not thousands - of divine intervention/assistance associated with the wearing of this medal. Miracles of conversion... miracles of healing... miracles of protections... and more!

Too many to list here. I invite you to Google 'miraculous medal miracles' to see some of them for yourself.

So... pray to our Holy Mother... ask for her intercession...

But remember... the Miraculous Medal itself is **not** magical... it's nothing more than a piece of metal. What holds the power is what / who it represents.

So... Light up those rings!

Ask for those graces that up to now have been unused (those graces for which people forget to ask)!


