

“With great power comes great responsibility.”

So goes the iconic line from the 2002 Spider-Man film in a poignant scene with Peter Parker and his wise Uncle Ben. We have all been given “great power” by God in the form of Time, Talents, and Treasure. Today’s readings remind us that this power is meant to be used for great good. And, that failure to do so has eternal consequences.

Our First Reading is again from the book of Amos. It warns of the danger of complacency. “Thus says the Lord the God of hosts: Woe to the complacent in Zion! Lying upon beds of ivory, stretched comfortably on their couches....” The Lord says that because of the complacency of the people, “They shall be the first to go into exile, and their wanton revelry shall be done away with.”

The tendency towards complacency is perhaps an even greater danger for us in the modern age with so many conveniences (fast food, remote controls, Amazon prime to name a few) and so many possibilities for diversion and entertainment (cable tv, laptops, iPads, cell phones, and the myriad other devices we all use).

The Lord’s message could not be any clearer — we must get off the couch and put our powers (the many gifts He has given us) to work!

The Second Reading, from St. Paul’s letter to Timothy shows us how to free ourselves of this dangerous complacency we are warned of in the First Reading.

Paul instructs us to:

- “Pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness.
- “Compete well for the faith.”
- “Lay hold of eternal life, to which [we] were called.” And
- “Keep [God’s] commandment without stain or reproach.”

Notice how active St. Paul’s word choices are: “pursue,” “compete,” “lay hold,” and “keep” are the terms he uses to instruct us.

Our Lord Himself gives us a very clear illustration of the urgency for us to put our powers to good use in today’s Gospel Passage from Luke. He tells the rather chilling parable of the rich man who ignored poor Lazarus during their lifetimes. At the moment of the rich man’s death, he goes down to the netherworld while Lazarus is taken to the eternal joy and comfort in the bosom of Abraham.

The rich man keenly regrets his complacency towards the needs of Lazarus, but it is too late for regret. His choices have played out and now the rich man will face the consequences of his failure to use the gifts God gave him.

A friend of mine once stated that he thought “*This life was for suffering.*” More recently another friend made the comment that “*This life was really hard!*” I think we’ve all heard comments like these... or maybe we’ve even made them ourselves. People are always asking the question, “*If God is such a loving God, why does he do, or allow, so many bad things to happen?*”

Well... as the people who attend RCIA have often heard... ***I’ve got a book!!***

Actually, this is a set of 3 books entitled “**Radio Replies**” written by a couple of priests who had a radio program ‘*back in the day*’ fielding questions from Catholics, Protestants, Agnostics... anyone who had a legitimate question. Some of the discipline they mention has changed... but the theology is sound! Let’s take a quick look...

Q: *If God is almighty He could prevent earthquakes, tornados, floods, etc., which kill many innocent people!*

A: If God were not almighty there would be no earthquakes, tornados, floods... and no people to be injured or killed! These things happen according to natural laws established by God and He is not obliged to interfere because we (*people*) are surprised or upset by them. Nor does the death of such people terminate their existence! The transition from earthly conditions to our future state is as normal as the transition from infancy to adolescence. Death is a natural law for all, and God permits it to come in various ways to various people.

Q: *If God is loving, just, and all-powerful, why does He permit evil or sin?*

A: Because God is Love, He asks the freely given love of man in return, and not a compelled love. Because He is just, He will not deprive man of the free will which is in accordance with his rational nature. Man cannot be free to love and serve God, without being free to reject Him and rebel against Him. ***We cannot have it both ways.*** God, if He wants men to be free, cannot take from them the power to choose evil. If He *enforces* goodness, He takes away freedom. If He leaves freedom, He *must* permit evil, even though He forbids it. It is man’s dignity that he is master of his own destiny - instead of having to develop and grow like a tree which must obey natural law. Man misused their freedom, and sin and brutality resulted. It was impossible to give man the gift of freedom and the dignity of being master of his own destiny without risking such failures.

Q: *Is it, then, God’s will that people should suffer from such terrible diseases as Cancer?*

A: We must distinguish between God’s *positive* will, and His *permissive* will. He *positively* wills all the good that happens. Suffering He *permits* to occur, and this only when he foresees that good can result from it. He *positively* wills that I should be holy. If He foresees that I will make use of good health to sin and to lose my soul, He may mercifully *permit* my health to be ruined, and thus lead me to Him where He would otherwise lose me. There would have been no diseases had men not sinned. God did not will sin, but having made men free, He *permitted* it and its consequences. This permission was a less serious thing than would have been depriving us of our freedom. Sin is the real evil, not suffering.

Bottom line... God wants what is best for us. He wants us to be happy with Him forever! *Our Choice.* He doesn’t *cause* suffering but *permits* it. Better to suffer a little here in this life than for eternity in the next! This is a complicated topic / subject... If you’d like to talk about it some more I’d love to hear from you.
